

## **WELLBEING MATTERS**

## Child Safe Standards

The Child Safe Standards commenced in Victoria in January 2016. After five years, it was evident that the standards improved safety for children and young people. Changes were made to make the standards even stronger in July 2022. The updated standards set out minimum requirements and outline the actions organisations must take to keep children and young people safe. They provide more clarity for organisations and are more consistent with Standards in the rest of Australia. There are eleven Child Safe Standards, and our school has enhanced our processes and policies to not only comply with the standards but to strengthen the actions we embed into our school organisation to ensure the safety of all children in our care.

## Victoria's Child Safe Standards

- Child Safe Standard 1 Establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.
- Child Safe Standard 2 Ensure that child safety and wellbeing are embedded in school leadership, governance and culture.
- Child Safe Standard 3 Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.
- Child Safe Standard 4 Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.
- Child Safe Standard 5 Equity is upheld and diverse needs are respected in policy and practice.
- Child Safe Standard 6 People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

- Child Safe Standard 7 Ensure that processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.
- Child Safe Standard 8 Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.
- Child Safe Standard 9 Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.
- Child Safe Standard 10 Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.
- Child Safe Standard 11 Policies and procedures that document how schools are safe for children, young people and students.
- Ministerial Order 1359 provides the framework for child safety in schools.

## PROTECT

## Everyone has the right to be safe and be protected from abuse.

No one should behave in a way that makes you feel unsafe or afraid, including anyone in your family, anyone at school or anywhere else in the community.

Tell a teacher or any adult at your school if you feel unsafe.





#### It's everyone's responsibility.

Adults at school must listen and respond to concerns about child abuse.

If you suspect abuse of any child or young person, you have a responsibility to report it, even if you are not sure.

## **Australian Early Development Census (AEDC)**

We are taking part in the AEDC beginning the 21/6/24. This is a national census that is conducted every three years by the Australian Government, in partnership with State and Territory Governments. It measures how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school. The AEDC is voluntary, so if you would like your child to be excluded from the data collection, please let the office know before the start date. Information packs have been sent home with students, if you have not received one, please contact your child's teacher.




